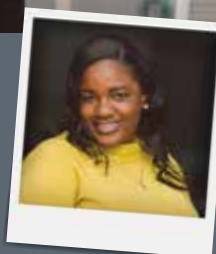
Excellent preparation for a UK bachelor's degree
